



Corporate Profile

The Saskatchewan Indian Gaming Authority (SIGA) operates Saskatchewan's six First Nations casinos. With approximately 2000 employees, SIGA casinos entertain over three million guests annually. SIGA is currently ranked in Saskatchewan's top 35 companies with annual revenues of over \$200M and profits of over \$60M.

SIGA's gaming operations are a revenue source for Saskatchewan's First Nations, the Provincial Treasury, and for Community Development Corporations situated in six casino locations. The CDC's distribute this money to charitable and not-for-profit community organizations.

The Province of Saskatchewan, through the Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority (SLGA), regulates SIGA. SLGA is responsible for the approval of budgets, operating policies and procedures, expansion of services, etc.

SIGA is responsible for the daily management and operation of accounting and auditing systems, the conduct of casino activities, the procurement and maintenance of gaming equipment and the casino's game delivery, in addition to security and surveillance.

Under the First Nations Gaming Act in 1995, the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations Inc. created the Saskatchewan Indian Gaming Authority. SIGA was incorporated under The Non-Profit Corporation Act of Saskatchewan in 1996.

SIGA has casinos located throughout Saskatchewan, including: Bear Claw Casino (White Bear), Dakota Dunes Casino (Whitecap Dakota First Nation/Saskatoon), Gold Eagle Casino (North Battleford), Northern Lights Casino (Prince Albert), Painted Hand Casino (Yorkton) and Living Sky Casino (Swift Current). The company's corporate office is located in Saskatoon, SK.
